




PICKUP OPTIONS



The Myers microphone pickup can be attached to a dulcimer using their special clip. That way you don't need to buy a dulcimer with a pickup in it or have one fitted. This is the one I have and it does sound very nice. However it does pick up a bit of string noise as it amplifies everything. I use a Myers in my YouTube Videos.



Thomann music also have two pickups suitable for dulcimer. I really like the idea of the (Schatten) passive pickup, no batteries, yay! I haven't yet tried these though.

LET'S READ TAB!






The 3 lines represent the 3 strings on the dulcimer. it is like you are looking at the dulcimer from above. Even though there are sometimes 2 treble strings very close together this will be represented



O means play the string with no fingers on frets. I means fret the string at the 1st fret, 2 means fret the string at the 2nd fret etc. The vertical lines are bar lines. They do not represent the frets. More about those later...


PLAYING A D MAJOR SCALE

STRUMMING AND CHORDS






Sounds like 'Horse with No Name:

I can't print the whole song with lyrics due to copyright, but the chords and strumming pattern are the same for THE WHOLE SONG!!


So here it is, use the video content to help you too, you can watch me play it and follow along..
